
Parking at Res East

Getting Around Campus

There are a number of ways to get you where you need to go — safely.

Ride the Tiger Line

- Shuttle service throughout campus at no additional charge, provided in partnership with City of Columbia.
- All buses equipped with GPS and can be tracked in real time on the Parking & Transportation website, or using the MizzouOne or ETA Spot app.
- Service runs daily until 8 p.m. for easy access to vehicles in perimeter lots.

Getting home safely

- Safety is our top priority Mizzou offers free assistance services to help you get home safely.
- Security escort: A security or campus safety officer will walk with you to a campus location, fraternity or sorority. Call 573-882-7201 to arrange a walk.
- Ride services to locations on campus are available if needed after 8 p.m.; visit the Parking & Transportation website to learn more.

Want to park on campus?

You will need a permit to park on campus. Buy a permit through your parking account beginning in July. Application window opens based on housing assignment.

Res North: July 17 Res East: July 18

No physical hang tags. You will receive a receipt and parking information via email.

A walkable community

- Campus blends seamlessly into downtown Columbia.
- Walking distance to restaurants, fitness, sports and performance events, both on and off campus.
- Take advantage of free campus resources and avoid meters, lot fees and parking citations.

Check email, website and texts

- Permit holders receive updates to their university email about events, construction, inclement weather, etc, that may impact parking.
- Access maps and learn more about enforcement hours and parking regulations on the Parking & Transportation website.
- Permit holders receive text messages to their mobile phones about events that may affect their parking assignments including game day lot changes.

Registering license plates

Pay attention to similar characters (like numbers "O" and "1"; letters "O" and "I") when registering your vehicle in your parking account. Vehicles will be flagged for citation if the license plate information is not registered correctly. (Missouri only uses "0" [zero] and "1".)
